

## Timber Sourcing Policy

Stamco Timber Limited is committed to identifying the source of all wood used as an input to its 'volume credit account' or in the manufacture of its FSC labelled products and to taking all reasonable measures to ensure that:

- a. Timber that has been illegally harvested
  - b. Timber from genetically modified trees.
  - c. Timber from areas where traditional or civil rights are violated.
  - d. Timber from uncertified high conservation value forests or from endangered forests.
- Or
- e. Timber from converted sources.

shall not be purchased by the company.

To this end all suppliers of non-FSC certified timber will be required to fill in a 'Timber Source Questionnaire' to accurately identify the forest of origin and using this information we will make available to concerned parties a list of all the countries from which we source our uncertified timber.

If it proves impossible to identify the forest of origin of some of our timber sources, we are committed to replacing them with supplies which can be sourced with confidence.

We will produce an annual report describing our system for verifying and monitoring our sources, the proportions of wood which has not yet been verified, and the steps being taken to replace/re-source this wood of unknown origin.

If it is demonstrated that wood from either a, b, c, d or e, above has been supplied to this company, either inadvertently or otherwise and may have been used as an input to the 'volume credit account' or in the manufacture of the company's FSC product groups, we will take prompt corrective action, including stopping further purchases from any company that has supplied us with wood from such sources.
